VetGen Research

VetGen is continuing their research in Hip dysplasia, Progressive Retinal Atrophy, and Early Onset Cataracts in Labrador Retrievers. We have already learned the genetic markers for other diseases and have developed DNA tests to determine which animals are clear, carrier and affected. This information will enable breeders to select the sire or dam which will prevent these hereditary diseases from affecting their puppies, and keep their lines clear of these problems.

To develop these new DNA tests for Labradors we need participation from owner/breeders who can supply us with crucial DNA samples from affected and unaffected dogs. Breed clubs can play an important part in

this by letting their members know about these research projects at club meetings, and through the club's newsletters.

For either the Hip Dysplasia or the Juvenile Cataract research we need DNA samples from families of dogs in which two or more are affected with Hip Dysplasia. Along with the DNA from the affected dogs we need DNA samples from either the sire or dam (preferably both) and several unaffected siblings when available. For our research on PRA we just need DNA samples from affected dogs. DNA is collected by means of small cheek swabs which are simple swiped in the dog's mouth.

When contacted we send sets of cheek swabs for DNA sample collection along with instructions, and self-addressed, stamped envelopes for their return. Participation is free and completely confidential.

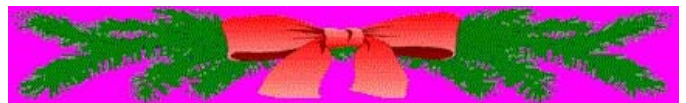

THE BUSTER CUBE

Dog psychologists have demonstrated that many behavioral problems can be reduced by *mental stimulation*.

Yes, in addition to physical activity and exercise we need to offer our dogs *mental* exercise and stimulation.

Through studies of wild dog's activities, dog psychologists Anders Hallgren and Marie Hansson Hallgren have identified three very important ingredients of mental stimulation.

- Sense of smell
- Problem solving
- Learning

The Buster Cube is an ingenious toy, which incorporates these three features to provide mental

stimulation for your dog. It is a fun way for him to utilize excess energy in a natural way.

By serving your dog ready-to-eat meals we have unwittingly eliminated one of his basic activities, hunting and foraging for food. These are activities in which the dog would have to use his natural instincts to find the food, work out how to catch it, etc. This sort of mental exercise is very important and your dog will be a happier and more contented individual if you can provide it in other forms. You will also help to prevent many common behavioral problems from developing in your dog. And, if you already have such problems, you might even be able to decrease their severity or eliminate them completely.

The Buster Cube has been developed by Mr. Kurt Jorgensen of Denmark, who has had many years of experience with dogs with behavioral problems.

Easy to Use

The Buster Cube is divided into several compartments which release dry food pellets when the dog rolls the Cube with his nose or paws. The smaller the food pellet the more pellets it takes before your dog feels full and the more energy he will use getting enough food out of the Cube.

It's important to reduce the dog's daily food allowance by an amount of food equal to what he eats when playing with the Cube.

Turning the cylinder towards min. or max. regulates the ease with which the food will be released, and is a way of adjusting the level of difficulty for your dog as he progresses. Enthusiastic Buster Cub players need a greater challenge!

The Buster Cube will withstand ordinary cleaning agents and is dishwasher safe.

Treat your dog to an inexpensive, high quality toy, which will greatly enrich live "playtime", producing a more contented dog.

How do I teach my dog to use a Buster Cube?

When the dog is introduced to a Buster Cube for the first time, the degree of difficulty is set at "max".

Fill the Cube with dry food, approximately one spoonful. Rotate the Buster Cube a couple of times to distribute the food in the Cube. Place the Buster Cube on the floor or ground with the hole facing upwards and let the dog smell at the hole. Push the Cube for the dog so that he can see how it works and soon learn what to do. In no time it will be necessary to change the degree of difficulty. Another good way of teaching the dog

how to use the cube is to give it its usual dry food by means of the Buster Cube. When the dog scents the well-known smell of food, it will activate the cube to get the food out.

Are all dogs able to use the Buster Cube?

Yes, the Cube rolls very easily and the dog does not need a lot of strength to activate the Cube. Just remember that the Buster Food Cube is for large dogs and the Buster Mini Cube is for small dogs.

How do I adjust the level of difficulty?

You can turn the inner tube from min. to max. When it is turned to max. the opening is widest and the largest amount of food will get out.

The Buster Cube is Easy to Use

Start the dog playing or eating by rolling the cube across the floor. The dog will use its nose to move the cube and gradually learn how to empty it, or in other words, the dog is rewarded with food or treats the more it plays with the cube. It is of course important to consider the extra nutritional energy intake provided through the cube. Therefore the daily amount of food must be kept at a level corresponding to the dog's needs in order to avoid obesity.

As the dog gets more experiences and empties the cube faster, it is possible to increase the level of difficulty and thus maintain the value of the cube. This is done by turning the cylinder towards maximum or minimum respectively in order to adjust the speed at which the food is released during play.

For filling and easy cleaning the central cylinder can be removed. Put your finger into the hole of the cylinder and turn towards MAX. Turn counterclockwise again until you hear a sound. Now it is possible to extract the cylinder. When replacing the cylinder please note that the tabs on the cylinder are three different sizes and should be placed into the three slots of corresponding sizes in the opening of the cube. Turn the cylinder clockwise towards MIN. When you hear the click sound then the cylinder is back in place and will turn only between MIN. and MAX.

Put the dry food into the Buster Cube through the opening. Turn the cube to distribute the food into the various compartments inside. Turn the central cylinder in the Buster Cube to adjust the level of difficulty.
